On October 6 2010 the groundbreaking ceremony was held for the soon-to-be Culinary Arts Academy at Land O' Lakes High School. Fast forward 10 months and all the construction is finally complete! The official grand opening of the building took place on October 5, 2011 and had a few guest speakers including the superintendent Heather Fiorentino .The 18,000 square foot academy consists of two kitchens, a bake shop, a 60 seat college-style classroom, a café and a dining room. The building is equipped with the latest technology and equipment. There are cameras and hanging flat-screen televisions in every room so you can sit in the classroom while watching the teacher do a demonstration in one of the kitchens! There's even an ice sculpting room! The academy has two instructors: Chef Cooper and Chef Rigberg. Currently there are about 170 students taking advantage of the culinary academy and all it has to offer.
