Graduation Requirements

24 Credits, including:

- **4 Credits of English**
- **4 Credits of Math**
 - 1 must be Algebra 1
 - 1 must be Geometry
- **3 Credits of Science**
 - 1 must be Biology
- **3 Credits of Social Studies**
 - World History
 - US History
 - US Government/Economics
- **1 Credit of a Fine Art**
- **1 Credit of Physical Education**
- **8 Credits of Electives**

NOTE: Two consecutive years of a foreign language (i.e., Spanish 1 and Spanish 2) are NOT required for high school graduation, but ARE required for the Bright Futures scholarship and admission to most 4-year universities.

1 Online Course

Pass the Algebra EOC or earn a concordant score on the PSAT, SAT, ACT, or Geometry EOC

Pass the Grade 10 ELA FSA or earn a concordant score on the SAT or ACT

2.000 Unweighted GPA

Graduation Requirements

- Cumulative unweighted GPA **MUST** be a 2.000 or higher.
 - Only final semester and full-year grades affect GPA.
 - Semester 1 = Average of Quarter 1% and Quarter 2%
 - Semester 2 = Average of Quarter 3% and Quarter 4%
 - A = 4.0, B = 3.0, C = 2.0, D = 1.0, F = 0.0

- Unweighted GPA vs. Weighted GPA
 - AP/DE/Honors and regular classes worth same points
 - Used to determine high school graduation, DE eligibility, sports eligibility, school privileges
 - AP/DE/Honors classes worth extra points
 - Honors = +0.5
 - DE/AP = +1.0
 - Used to determine Bright Futures eligibility, apply to colleges, etc.

 - 497 Scale Score

- PSAT
 - 430 Math score

- SAT
 - 420 Math Score

- ACT
 - 16 Math Score

- Geometry EOC
 - 499 Math Score

- 10th Grade ELA
 - Achievement Level 3
 - 350 Scale Score

- SAT
 - 480 Reading/Writing

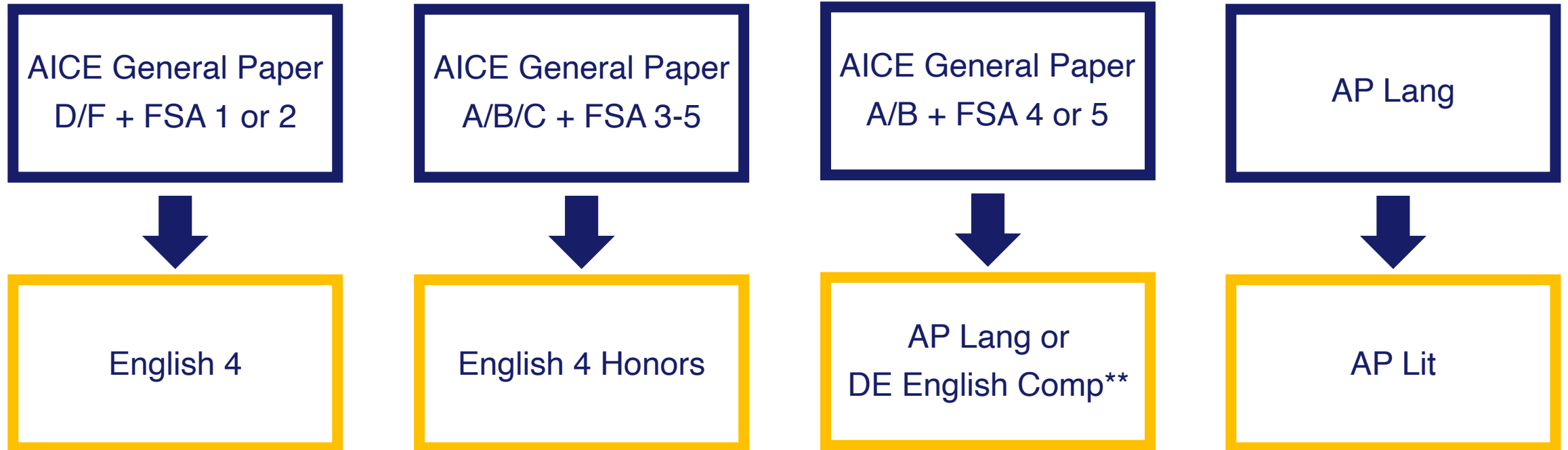
- ACT
 - 18 Reading/English

Graduation Requirements

- At this point, 11th graders should have 15 credits and at least a 2.000 GPA to be considered on track for graduation.
- At the end of 11th grade, students should have 18 credits and at least a 2.000 GPA to be considered on track for graduation.

Math: 4 Credits Required for Graduation



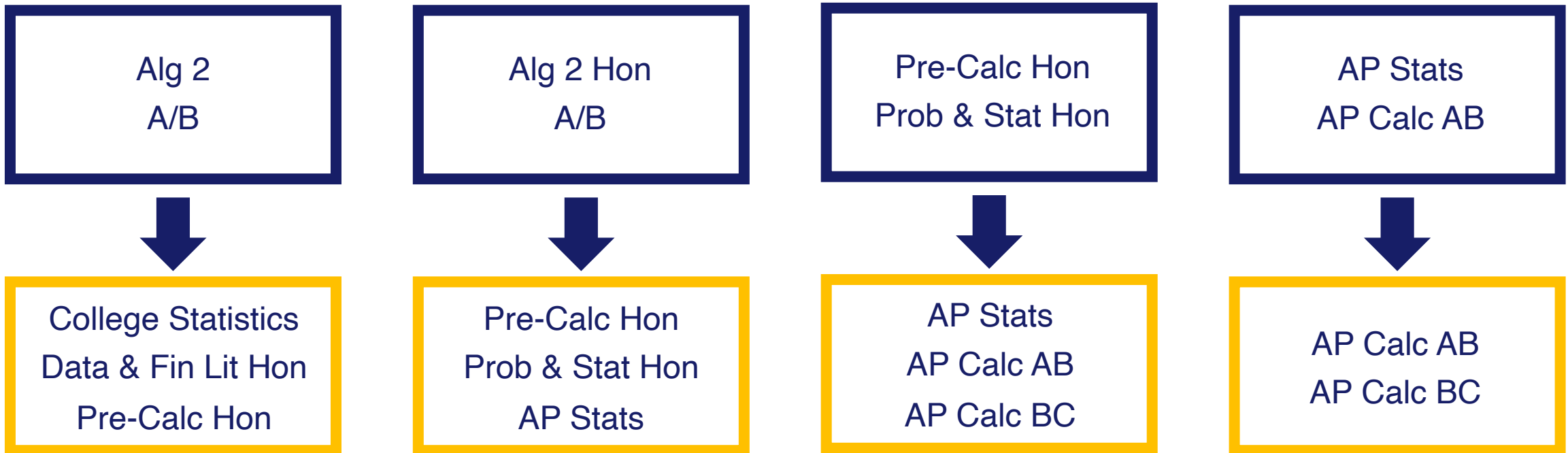
Math for Liberal Arts: Includes some of this and some of that (Algebra, Geometry, Probability, Statistics, & Logic). Recommended course for anyone who has not passed EOCs.

Math for College Algebra: Includes elements of Algebra 2. Good fit for students who want to review Algebra skills.

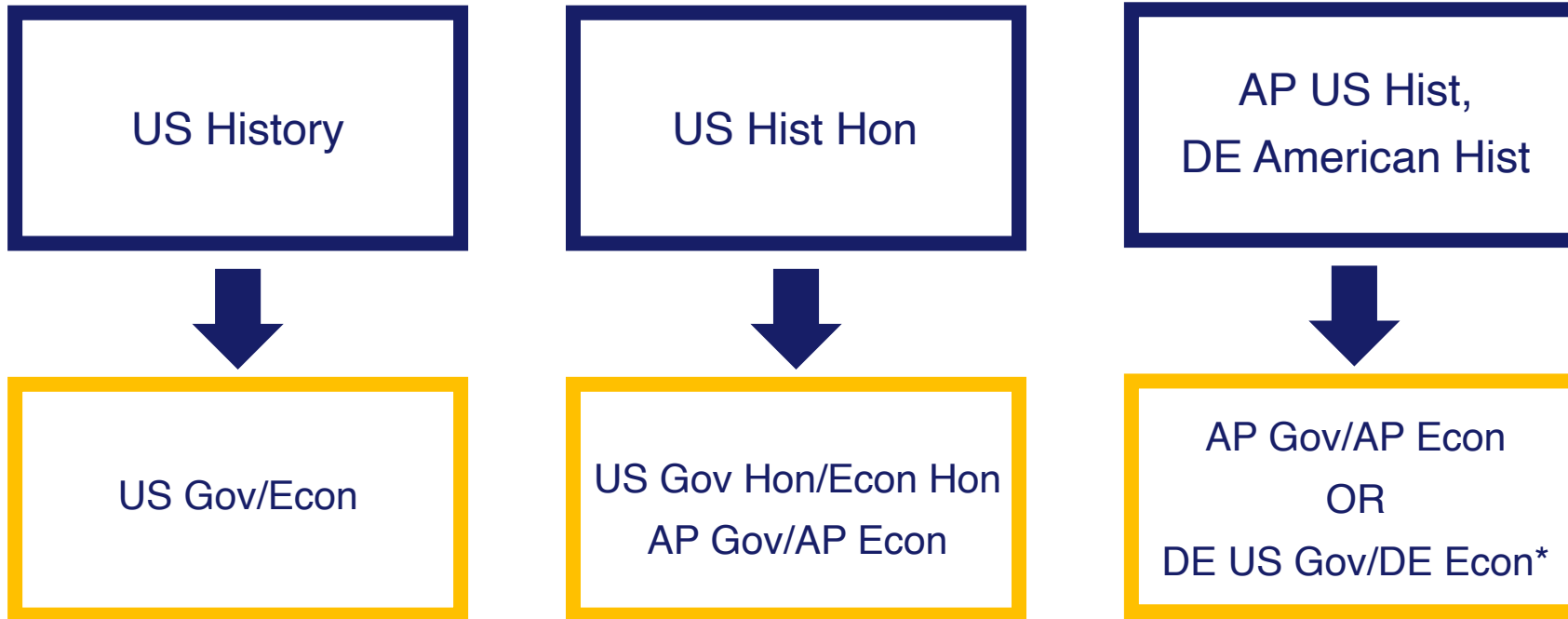
Math for College Statistics: Analyzing and applying probability and data. Includes some Algebra skills.

Math for Data & Financial Literacy: A complimentary course to Economics. Real-world applications related to financial concepts (basic economic and accounting principles).

- Meeting the PE graduation requirement:
 - 1.0 Credit of HOPE
 - 0.5 Credit of Personal Fitness (online) + 0.5 Credit of on campus PE class such as Weight Training
 - 0.5 Credit of Personal Fitness (online) + 0.5 Credit Outdoor Education or Fitness Lifestyle Design (online)
 - 0.5 Credit of Personal Fitness (online) + Marching Band Waiver***
 - Waiver from 2 seasons of a JV or Varsity sport at LOLHS***

***IMPORTANT: You do not earn credit for waivers, so you would need to complete extra elective credits. Follow up with counselor if you want a waiver entered.

Electives

- **Peers as Partners in Learning vs. Leadership Skills Development**
 - Leadership Skills: assigned to staff, providing administrative support to staff
 - Peers as Partners: assigned to a teacher's room, providing support to students
 - Application required
- **Culinary Arts**
 - Must be in the Culinary Academy in order to take Culinary Arts.
 - Seniors have two periods of Culinary Arts during their day (Culinary 3 and 4).
 - Potential for 3rd Culinary Elective (Hospitality & Tourism; if there is space on their schedule, write in on course card)
- **Accounting, Management, Business Analysis**
 - Pre-requisite: Digital Info Tech OR Business Entrepreneur Principles

Electives

- OJT (On-The-Job Training)
 - Opportunity to earn high school elective credit and a paycheck from the employer.
 - For each period of OJT, student must be working a minimum of 5 hours per week at their job.
 - This is no longer offered through LOLHS. Students who want OJT next year will have an eSchool Off-Campus placeholder and will need to sign up for OJT through Pasco eSchool.
 - Co-Requisite: DCT Principles is the required co-curricular course with lessons and assignments about the world of work (employability skills, workplace safety, communication, business ethics, etc.)
 - Students earn credit for each OJT period and DCT.
 - Having OJT does NOT guarantee a parking pass; Students must be ON TRACK for graduation to get a parking pass.

eSchool Placeholders

- eSchool On or eSchool Off Campus
- If a student has an eSchool placeholder on their schedule, they **MUST** sign up for **AND** complete an eSchool course to earn the credit.
- LOLHS Students cannot have more than 3 eSchool placeholders.
- If you have not met online course requirement, can be done this way as a senior.
- Students with off-campus placeholders (eSchool or PHSC) **MUST** have daily transportation. They cannot be on campus during those periods.

Course Selection Reminders

- Students must have 6 courses selected, as well as 2-3 backup options for electives. (If one of the courses is a semester course, you must select another semester course to go with it.)
- Talk to your current teachers for recommendations about core course options for you.
- Things to think about when making course decisions:
 - Am I meeting high school graduation requirements?
 - Potential majors in college?
 - Will this prepare me for the career I want to pursue?
